Embers and sparks cause fires, and an ember attack causes a wildfire!

Hence, an important step in preventing a wildfire is hardening our homes in this community, i.e., making our homes ember resistant.

Home hardening is a **MUST** for becoming FireWise

Note: Measure X pays **50% of the cost of home hardening, up to \$2000, per house.**

You could apply for it directly for any home hardening project. You are urged to do it while the budget is still available!

Red Flag Day

A Red Flag Warning is issued for weather events which may result in **extreme fire behavior that will occur within 24 hours**. A Fire Weather Watch is issued when weather conditions could exist in the next 12-72 hours. A Red Flag Warning is the highest alert. During these times extreme caution is urged by all residents, because **a simple spark can cause a major wildfire**. A Fire Weather Watch is one level below a warning, but fire danger is still high. -Do not BBQ.

-Do not throw cigarettes or matches out of a moving vehicle. They may ignite dry grass on the side of the road and become a wildfire.

-Never leave a fire unattended. Sparks or embers can blow into leaves or grass, ignite a fire, and quickly spread.

As you see in the table below, a combination of low humidity and strong wind could lead to a **Red Flag Warning (RFW)**. In a **Particularly Dangerous Situation (PDS)**, you are urged to leave home and evacuate even without any evacuation orders.

Zonehaven is a company that provides the technology to manage an evacuation process in "zone" divisions of a wildfire area. All fire departments in Contra Costa County, as well as Alameda, use this technology. Hence, you need to know your "zone" to be able to understand evacuation orders.
